## **SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION**

The Fine Arts Parents Association administers three scholarships for outstanding music students in the Halifax Regional Centre for Education (HRCE). They are the Kaye Dimock Pottie Scholarship, the Karen Oxley Kennedy Scholarship, and the Chalmers Doane Scholarship.

Applications consist of an application form, to be completed by the student and a letter of recommendation, to be written by a Halifax Regional Arts Music (West) or Halifax Regional Centre for Education music staff member. Students are encouraged to discuss their interest in the scholarships with the staff member, prior to the staff person submitting the letter of recommendation. Students may apply for more than one scholarship, but a given student can only be awarded one scholarship.

Application forms and letters of recommendation (letter to be sent directly by staff member) must be sent to the Halifax Regional Arts Music (West) Department Head, Nathan Beeler by May 1<sup>st</sup>, with “FAPA Scholarship Application” in the subject line.

Applications will be reviewed by a Selection Committee consisting of a minimum of the Halifax Regional Arts Music (West) Director, a Halifax Regional Arts Music (West) or Halifax Regional Centre for Education staff member and a member from the Fine Arts Parents Association.

### **KAYE DIMOCK POTTIE SCHOLARSHIP**

The Kaye Dimock Pottie Scholarship Trust, dated September 29, 1993, provides a scholarship of \$500 to an outstanding music student graduating from a Halifax Regional Centre for Education high school. The successful candidate(s) must demonstrate a high degree of proficiency and leadership qualities, and must be pursuing the study of music.

### **KAREN OXLEY KENNEDY SCHOLARSHIP**

The Karen Oxley Kennedy Scholarship Trust, dated January 16, 1999, provides a scholarship of \$500 to an outstanding music student in choral programs graduating from a Halifax Regional Centre for Education high school. The successful candidate(s) must demonstrate a high degree of proficiency in vocal musicianship.

### **CHALMERS DOANE SCHOLARSHIP**

The Chalmers Doane Scholarship Trust, dated March 8, 2000, provides \$500 scholarship to an outstanding music student graduating from a Halifax Regional Centre for Education high school. The successful candidate(s) must demonstrate a high degree of musicianship as well as both leadership and participation in music program(s).
